Psalms, readings and collect

Date: 4th May – Easter III

Obviously on Low Sunday, people will use the Act of Spiritual Communion; but for those who wish to say an evening office, provision is included here.

Office

Psalm:

(80: 1 - 7) HEAR, O thou Shepherd of Israel, thou that leadest Joseph like a sheep: shew thyself also, thou that sittest upon the cherubims.

- 2 Before Ephraim, Benjamin, and Manasses: stir up thy strength, and come, and help us.
- 3 Turn us again, O God: shew the light of thy countenance, and we shall be whole.
- 4 O Lord God of hosts: how long wilt thou be angry with thy people that prayeth?
- 5 Thou feedest them with the bread of tears : and givest them plenteousness of tears to drink.
- 6 Thou hast made us a very strife unto our neighbours: and our enemies laugh us to scorn.
- 7 Turn us again, thou God of hosts: shew the light of thy countenance, and we shall be whole.

Glory be to the Father and to the Son: and to the Holy Ghost.

As it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be: world without end. Amen.

Reading:

A Reading from the Book of the Apocalypse.

Then I, John, looked, and I heard around the throne and the living creatures and the elders the voice of many angels, numbering myriads of myriads and thousands of thousands, saying with a loud voice, "Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honour and glory and blessing!" And I heard every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth and in the sea, and all therein, saying, "To him who sits upon the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honour and glory and might for ever and ever!" And the four living creatures said, "Amen!" and the elders fell down and worshipped.

Collect of the day:

Almighty God, Who hast given Thine only Son to be unto us both a sacrifice for sin, and also an example of Godly life: Give us Grace that we may always most thankfully receive that His inestimable benefit, and also daily endeavour ourselves to follow the blessed steps of His most holy Life: in and through Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, throughout all ages world without end. Amen.

Act of Spiritual Communion

Collect:

God of life, in Your risen Son Your reveal Your abiding Presence among us and summon those reborn in Baptism to lives of worship and service. Fill this assembly with reverence and prayer. Grant us courage and zeal in bearing witness before the world to Your Son, Jesus Christ, the First-born from the dead, Who is alive and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, God, throughout all ages world without end. Amen.

First Reading:

A Reading from the Book of the Acts of the Apostles.

The high priest questioned the Apostles, saying, "We strictly charged you not to teach in this name, yet here you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching and you intend to bring this man's blood upon us." But Peter and the apostles answered, "We must obey God rather than men. The God of our fathers raised Jesus whom you killed by hanging him on a tree. God exalted him at his right hand as Leader and Saviour, to give repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins. And we are witnesses to these things, and so is the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him." So they took his advice, and when they had called in the apostles, they beat them and charged them not to speak in the name of Jesus, and let them go. Then they left the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer dishonour for the name.

Psalm:

I will exalt you, O Lord, because you have raised me up ◆ and have not let my foes triumph over me.

You brought me up, O Lord, from the dead; ◆ you restored me to life from among those that go down to the Pit.

Sing to the Lord, you servants of his; ◆ give thanks to his holy name.

For his wrath endures but the twinkling of an eye, his favour for a lifetime. • Heaviness may endure for a night, but joy comes in the morning.

'Hear, O Lord, and have mercy upon me; • O Lord, be my helper.'

You have turned my mourning into dancing; • you have put off my sackcloth and girded me with gladness.

Gospel:

A Reading from the Gospel according to Saint John.

Jesus revealed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tibe'ri-as; and he revealed himself in this way. Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathan'a-el of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zeb'edee, and two others of his disciples were together. Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We will go with you." They went out and got into the boat; but that night they caught nothing. Just as day was breaking, Jesus stood on the beach; yet the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, have you any fish?" They answered him, "No." He said to them, "Cast the net on the right side of the boat, and you will find some." So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in, for the

quantity of fish. That disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on his clothes, for he was stripped for work, and sprang into the sea. But the other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, but about a hundred yards off. When they got out on land, they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish lying on it, and bread. Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish that you have just caught." So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, a hundred and fifty-three of them; and although there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." Now none of the disciples dared ask him, "Who are you?" They knew it was the Lord. Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and so with the fish. This was now the third time that Jesus was revealed to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.
