- 11 Quicken me, O Lord, for thy Name's sake : and for thy righteousness' sake bring my soul out of trouble.
- 12 And of thy goodness slay mine enemies : and destroy all them that vex my soul; for I am thy servant.

A Reading from the Gospel according to Saint Luke.

Yes, I tell you, it shall be required of this generation. Woe to you lawyers! for you have taken away the key of knowledge; you did not enter yourselves, and you hindered those who
