**In this booklet**, the Officiant's parts are printed in blue and those of the congregation in black.

The Liturgy of Benediction is the amalgamation of two devotions: Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and the Benediction itself. Exposition involves the display of the consecrated Host, in Which inheres the Presence of Christ, so that we may offer our worship and intercession. It is an elongation of that moment in the Mass between the Great Amen at the end of the Eucharistic Prayer and Holy Communion. At the end, Benediction is given when, in place of a priest's blessing, we receive the blessing of Christ Himself.

All <u>STAND</u> as the Officiant and those with him enter the church; all sing this commemoration of the Blessed Virgin Mary:

O higher than the Cherubim,
More glorious than the Seraphim,
Lead their praises, alleluia!
Thou bearer of the eternal Word,
Most gracious magnify the Lord.
Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!

'Lord, Thy glory fills the Heaven; Earth is with its fullness stored; Unto Thee be glory given, Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord.'

Heaven is still with glory ringing, Earth takes up the angels' cry, 'Holy, Holy, Holy,' singing 'Lord of Hosts, the Lord most high.'


With His Seraph train before Him, With His holy Church below, Thus unite we to adore Him, Bid we thus our anthem flow:

A bell rings to signify the end of the Liturgy and all <u>STAND</u>.

But grant them grace that they may strain The heavenly gate and prize to gain: Each harmful lure aside to cast, And purge away each error past.


O Father, that we ask be done, Through Jesus Christ, Thine only Son, Who with the Spirit and with Thee Doth live and reign eternally.

- 2 Let my prayer be set forth in thy sight as the *in*cense : and let the lifting up of my hands be an *e*vening sacrifice.
- 3 Set a watch, O Lord, be fore my mouth: and keep the door of my lips.
- 4 O let not mine heart be inclined to any evil thing: let me not be occupied in ungodly works with the men that work wickedness, | lest I eat of such *things* as please them.
- 5 Let the righteous rather smite me *friend*ly: (-) *and* reprove me.
- 6 But let not their precious balms *break* my head: yea, I will pray yet a*gainst* their wickedness.
- 7 Let their judges be overthrown in stony *places*: that they may hear my *words*, for they are sweet.
- 8 Our bones lie scattered be *fore* the pit: like as when one breaketh and heweth *wood* upon the earth.
- 9 But mine eyes look unto thee, *O* Lord God: in thee is my trust, O *cast* not out my soul.
- 10 Keep me from the snare that they have *laid* for me : and from the traps of the *wicked* doers.


Crown Him the Lord of peace, whose power a sceptre sways

Their fragrance ever sweet.


Crown Him the Lord of years,






As we prepare for Benediction, the following hymn is sung. When the bell rings, all KNEEL.


