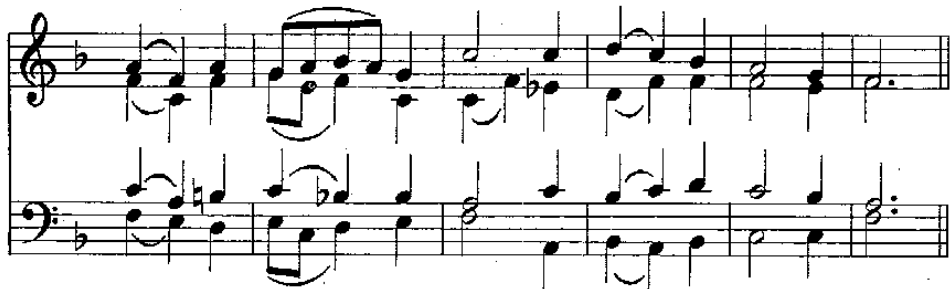
1. Jesus Christ, to Whom the number
