A Reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah.

For behold, I create new heavens and a new earth; and the former things shall not be remembered or come into mind. The preparation of the Altar continues; incense may be used to honour the place where Christ will become present. At the end:

The priest begins the great prayer of thanksgiving:

The priest holds up the chalice of consecrated wine for the people to see.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did,

made once for all upon the cross.
Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation,
we proclaim his death and resurrection
until he comes in glory.

Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

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Lord of all life,
help us to work together for that day
when your kingdom comes
and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth.
Look with favour on your people,
gather us in your loving arms
and bring us with [*N and*] all the saints
to feast at your table in heaven.

Through Jesus Christ, our Lord,

+ Behold the Lamb of God; behold Him, Who takes away the sin of the world; happy are they who are called to His Supper.

Lord, I am not worthy to receive You; but only say the Word and my soul will be healed.

Happy are the pure in heart for they shall see God: happy the peacemakers; they shall be called children of God.
