**Text of the Vigil and First Mass of Easter (30<sup>th</sup> March) 2024**

*The priest introduces the Liturgy:*

On this most holy night, when our Lord Jesus Christ passed from Death to life, the Church invites her children throughout the world to come together in vigil and prayer. This is the Passover of the Lord: if we honour the memory of his Death and Resurrection by hearing His Word and celebrating His mysteries, then we may be confident that we shall share His victory over death and live with Him for ever with God.

*The priest blesses the Easter fire:*

Let us pray:

Father,  
we share the light of your glory  
through your Son, the Light of the world.  
Make this new fire holy, and inflame us with new hope.  
Purify our minds by this Easter celebration  
and bring us one day to the feast of eternal light.  
We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord.

*The priest consecrates the Paschal Candle:*

Christ yesterday and today the beginning and the end Alpha and Omega. All time belongs to Him and all ages to Him be glory and power through every age for ever.

*Light the candle:*

May the Light of Christ, rising in glory, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds.

*The Exsultet (the proclamation of Easter) follows:*

Rejoice, heavenly powers! Sing, choirs of angels! Exult, all creation around God's throne! Jesus Christ, our King, is risen! Sound the trumpet of salvation! Rejoice, O earth, in shining splendour, radiant in the brightness of your King! Christ has conquered! Glory fills you! Darkness vanishes for ever! Rejoice, O Mother Church! Exult in glory! The risen Saviour shines upon you! Let this place resound with joy, echoing the mighty song of all God's people! My dearest friends, standing with me in this holy light, join me in asking God for mercy, that he may give his unworthy minister grace to sing his Easter praises.

The Lord be with you.

And with thy spirit.

Lift up your hearts;

We lift them up unto the Lord.

Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.

It is meet and right so to do.

It is truly right that with full hearts and minds and voices we should praise the unseen God, the all-powerful Father, and his only Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. For Christ has ransomed us with his blood, and paid for us the price of Adam's sin to our eternal Father! This is our Passover feast, when Christ, the true Lamb, is slain, whose blood consecrates the homes of all believers. This is the night when first you saved our fathers: you freed the people of Israel from their slavery and led them dry-shod through the sea. This is the night when the pillar of fire destroyed the darkness of sin! This is the night when Christians everywhere, washed clean of sin and freed from all defilement, are restored to grace and grow together in holiness. This is the night when Jesus Christ broke the chains of death and rose triumphant from the grave. What good would life have been to us, had Christ not come as our Redeemer? Father, how wonderful your care for us! How boundless your merciful love! To ransom a slave you gave away your Son. O happy fault, O necessary sin of Adam, which gained for us so great a Redeemer! Most blessed of all nights, chosen by God to see Christ rising from the dead! Of this night scripture says: "The night will be as clear as day: it will become my light, my joy." The power of this holy night dispels all evil, washes guilt away, restores lost innocence, brings mourners joy; it casts out hatred, brings us peace, and humbles earthly pride. Night truly blessed when heaven is wedded to earth and man is reconciled with God! Therefore, heavenly Father, in the joy of this night, receive our evening sacrifice of praise, your Church's solemn offering. Accept this Easter candle, a flame divided but undimmed, a pillar of fire that glows to the honour of God. Let it mingle with the lights of heaven and continue bravely burning to dispel the darkness of this night! May the morning Star which never sets find this flame still burning: Christ, that Morning Star, who came back from the dead, and shed his peaceful light on all mankind, your Son who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

We have begun our solemn vigil. Let us now listen to the Word of God recalling how He saved His people throughout history and, in the fullness of time, sent His own Son to be our Redeemer.

A reading from the Book of the Genesis:

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. The earth was without form and void, and darkness was upon the face of the deep; and the Spirit of God was moving over the face of the waters. God said, 'Let us make man in our image, after our likeness; and let them have dominion over all the earth.' So God created man in His own image; male and female He created them. And God saw everything that He had made and, behold, it was very good.

The earth is full of your creatures. ♦ Bless the Lord, O my soul.

Let us pray:

Almighty God, who wonderfully created us in your own image and yet more wonderfully restored us through your Son Jesus Christ: grant that, as He came to share in our humanity, so we may share the life of His divinity; Who is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God now and for ever.

A reading from the Book of the Exodus:

The Lord said to Moses, "Tell the people of Israel to go forward. Lift up your rod, and stretch out your hand over the sea and divide it, that the people of Israel may go on dry ground through the sea. Then the angel of God who went before the host of Israel moved and went behind them; and the pillar of cloud moved from before them and stood behind them, coming between the host of Egypt and the host of Israel. Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea; and the Lord drove the sea back and the waters were divided. And the people of Israel went into the midst of the sea on dry ground, the waters being a wall to them on their right hand and on their left. The Egyptians pursued, and went in after them into the midst of the water. Then the Lord said to Moses, 'Stretch out your hand over the sea, that the waters may come back upon the Egyptians, upon their chariots, and upon their horsemen.' So Moses stretched forth his hand over the sea, and the sea returned to its wonted flow; the waters returned and covered the Egyptians. Thus the Lord saved Israel that day from the hand of the Egyptians.

A reading from the letter of Saint Paul to the Church in Rome.

Have you forgotten that when we were baptized into union with Christ Jesus we were baptized into His Death? By baptism we were buried with Him, and lay dead, in order that, as Christ was raised from the dead in the splendour of the Father, so also we might set our feet upon the new path of life. We know that Christ, once raised from the dead, is never to die again: He is no longer under the dominion of death. For in dying as He died, He died to sin, once for all, and in living as He lives, He lives to God. In the same way you must regard yourselves as dead to sin and alive to God, in union with Christ Jesus.

At the very dawn of creation Your Spirit breathed on the waters, making them the wellspring of all holiness. The waters of the great flood You made a sign of the waters of baptism, that make an end of sin and a new beginning of goodness. Through the waters of the Red Sea You led Israel out of slavery, to be an image of God's holy people, set free from sin by Baptism. In the waters of the Jordan Your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Spirit. Your Son willed that water and Blood should flow from his side as He hung upon the Cross. After his Resurrection He told His disciples: "Go out and teach all nations, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." Father, look now with love upon Your Church, and unseal for her the fountain of Baptism. By the power of the Holy Spirit give to the water of this font the grace of Your Son. You created man in Your own likeness: cleanse him from sin in a new birth of innocence by water and the Spirit. We ask You, Father, with Your Son to send the Holy Spirit upon the waters of this font. May all who are buried with Christ in the death of baptism rise also with Him to newness of life. We ask this through Christ our Lord; by Whom and with Whom and in Whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, we worship You, Father almighty in songs of everlasting praise.

was crucified, died, and was buried;  
He descended to the dead.

On the third day He rose again.

He ascended into Heaven,  
He is seated at the right hand of the Father,
