Text of the Mass for Lady Day – 8th April 2024

As the priest enters the church, the following is sung:

As Christ came into the world, He said: "Behold, I have come to do Your Will, O God. Alleluia! The Heavens declare the Glory of God: and the firmament proclaims the work of Your hands. Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Ghost; as it was in the beginning is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. As Christ came into the world &c

+ The Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you. And with thy spirit.

Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed. Alleluia!

The Grace of God has dawned upon the world through our Saviour Jesus Christ, Who has sacrificed Himself for us to purify a people as His own. Let us, therefore, confess our sins.

We often fail to walk the way of the Cross: Kyrie eleison. Kyrie eleison, Kyrie eleison, Kyrie eleison. Almighty God, who forgives all who truly repent, have mercy upon *you*, pardon and deliver *you* from all *your* sins, confirm and strengthen *you* in all goodness, and keep *you* in life eternal; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Let us go forth in peace. In the Name of Christ. Amen.

During the **Gloria in excelsis**, the Altar, the symbol of God's Presence, may be honoured with incense.

Glory be to God on high. And in earth peace, goodwill towards men. We praise Thee, we bless Thee, we worship Thee, we glorify Thee, we give thanks to Thee for Thy great glory, O Lord God, heavenly King, God the Father almighty. O Lord, the only-begotten Son, Jesus Christ: O Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, that takest away the sins of the world, have mercy upon us. Thou that takest away the sins of the world, receive our prayer. Thou that sittest at the right hand of God the Father, have mercy upon us. For Thou only art holy, Thou only art the Lord; Thou only, O Christ, with the Holy Ghost, art most high. + in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Let us pray:

We beseech You, O Lord, pour Your Grace into our hearts, that as we have known the Incarnation of Your Son Jesus Christ by the message of an angel, so by His Cross and Passion we may be brought to the glory of His Resurrection; in and through the same Your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, Who lives with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, throughout all ages, world without end. Amen.

A Reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah.

The LORD spoke to Ahaz, "Ask a sign of the LORD your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven." But Ahaz said, "I will not ask, and I will not put the LORD to the test." And he said, "Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary men, that you weary my God also? Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, a young woman shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Imman'u-el, a Name which means, "God-is-with-us."

This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

A Reading from the former Letter to the Hebrews.

It is impossible that the blood of bulls and goats should take away sins. Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said, "Sacrifices and offerings thou hast not desired, but a body hast thou prepared for me; in burnt offerings and sin offerings thou hast taken no pleasure. Then I said, `Lo, I have come to do thy will, O God,' as it is written of me in the roll of the book." When he said above, "Thou hast neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings" (these are offered according to the law), then he added, "Lo, I have come to do thy will." He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. And by that will we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

The Gospel book is carried to the Lectern:

Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia! The Word was made flesh and lived among us: and we have seen His Glory. Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!

Christ's Presence in the words of the Gospel may be honoured with incense.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. Glory be to Thee, O Lord.

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Hail, O favored one, the Lord is with you!" But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and considered in her mind what sort of greeting this might be.

And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of his kingdom there will be no end." And Mary said to the angel, "How shall this be, since I have no husband?" And the angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God. And behold, your kinswoman Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month with her who was called barren. For with God nothing will be impossible." And Mary said, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word." And the angel departed from her.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise be to Thee, O Christ.

A homily may follow.

We believe in one God. the Father almighty. Maker of Heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible. And in one Lord Jesus Christ. the only begotten Son of God, begotten of His Father before all worlds. God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten not made; being of one substance with the Father, by Whom all things were made; Who for us men and for our salvation came down from Heaven and was incarnate by the Holy Ghost of the Virgin Mary, and was made man. and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate.

He suffered and was buried. and the third day He rose again according to the Scriptures, and ascended into Heaven. and sitteth on the right hand of the Father. And He shall come again in glory to judge both the quick and the dead; Whose Kingdom shall have no end. And we believe in the Holy Ghost, the Lord, the Giver of life, Who proceedeth from the Father and the Son, Who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified, Who spake by the prophets. And we believe one Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church, We acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins. And we look for the resurrection of the dead. + and the life of the world to come. Amen.

As Mary obeyed God's Will for her to become the mother of His Son, let us turn in obedience to Him and lay before Him the needs of the world and the Church:

Lord God, Who chose the Virgin Mary to be the Mother of Your Son: strengthen in holiness all who seek by their lives to praise and magnify Your holy Name: Lord, in Your mercy ... hear our prayer.

Lord God, Who through the Angel Gabriel brought a message of peace and joy to Mary: hasten the day when all the world may rejoice in the Peace of salvation: Lord, in Your mercy ... hear our prayer.

Lord God, Whose Word dwelt among us by the consent of Your handmaid and the power of the Holy Spirit: open the ears of many to the voice of Christ and their hearts to His Truth: Lord, in Your mercy ... hear our prayer.

Lord God, Whose servant conceived Your Son at Your invitation: bless all who work as midwives and hear the pleading of those who crave the gift of a child: Lord, in Your mercy ... hear our prayer.

Lord God, Whose Will it is to raise the lowly and fills the hungry with good things: encourage the downhearted, come to the aid of those in need and comfort those close to death: Lord, in Your mercy ... hear our prayer.

Lord God, Who does great things for us; mindful of Your mercy receive those who have died into Your glorious Kingdom: Lord, in Your mercy ... hear our prayer.

In union with our Lady, Saint Matthew, Saint Philip, Saint Augustine and all the saints, we pray that the whole world may come to praise and magnify God's holy Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed. Alleluia!

God has set His Sanctuary in our midst for evermore; and established a covenant of peace. The Peace of the Lord be always with you. And with thy spirit.

As the bread and wine are brought to the Altar and prepared for the Mass, the following is sung:

The rod of Jesse has put forth buds; the Virgin has given firth to the God-Man: God has re-established peace; in Himself He has reconciled earth with Heaven. Alleluia!

Here, while the Cherubim within the veil, adore the blest, life-giving Trinity, we in earth's worship echoing their part, hymn the thrice-holy in their company. So let all earthly cares be laid aside, that we may welcome Him Who draweth nigh, the King of Glory entering His courts, girt by the hidden armies of the sky. Miserere, miserere, miserere nobis!

We pray Thee, heavenly Father, To hear us in Thy love, And pour upon Thy children The unction from above; That so in love abiding, From all defilement free, We may in pureness offer Our Eucharist to Thee.

All that we have we offer, For it is all Thine own, All gifts, by Thine appointment, In bread and wine are shown; One thing alone we bring not, The wilfulness of sin, And all we bring is nothing Save that which is within.

Within the pure oblation, Beneath the outward sign, By that His operation, -The Holy Ghost divine, -Lies hid the sacred Body, Lies hid the precious Blood, Once slain, now ever glorious, Of Christ our Lord and God.

Wherefore, though all unworthy To offer sacrifice, We pray that this our duty Be pleasing in Thine eyes; For praise and thanks and worship, For mercy and for aid, The Catholic oblation Of Jesus Christ is made.

The preparation of the Altar continues; incense may be used to honour the place where Christ will become present. At the end:

Thine, O Lord, is the greatness, the power and the glory and the victory and the majesty. All that is in Heaven and earth is Thine: All things come of Thee, O Lord, and of Thine own do we give Thee.

Almighty God, so fill us with Your Grace, that we in all things may accept Your holy Will and with the Virgin Mary, full of Grace, rejoice in Your salvation; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. The priest begins the great prayer of thanksgiving:

The Lord be with you. And with thy spirit. Lift up your hearts; We lift them up unto the Lord. Let us give thanks unto our Lord God. It is meet and right so to do.

It is indeed right and good, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, holy Father, almighty and eternal God, through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord. We give you thanks and praise that the Virgin Mary heard with faith the message of the angel, and by the power of your Holy Spirit conceived and bore the Word made flesh. From the warmth of her womb to the stillness of the grave he shared our life in human form. In him new light has dawned upon the world and you have become one with us that we might become one with you in your glorious kingdom. Therefore earth unites with heaven to sing a new song of praise; we too join with angels and archangels as they proclaim your glory without end:

Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of Thy glory. Glory be to Thee, O Lord most high.

+ Blessed is He that cometh in the Name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest. We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his Apostles and, taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

The priest holds up the consecrated Host for the people to see.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you, gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

The priest holds up the chalice of consecrated wine for the people to see.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did,in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross.Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation,we proclaim his death and resurrectionuntil he comes in glory.

Lord, by Your Cross and Resurrection, You have set us free; You are the Saviour of the world.

Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth. Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with [*N and*] all the saints to feast at your table in heaven.

Through Jesus Christ, our Lord, By Whom and with Whom and in Whom, Amen, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, Amen, all honour and glory are Yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever. Amen, amen.

Instructed by saving precepts and taught by divine example, we are bold to say: Our Father, Who art in Heaven, hallowed by Thy Name;

Thy Kingdom come, Thy Will be done on earth as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the Kingdom, the power and the glory for ever and ever. Amen.

We break this bread to share in the Body of Christ. Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread. O Lamb of God, that takest away the sins of the world, have mercy upon us. The priest holds up the consecrated elements and invites people to receive Holy Communion:

+ Behold the Lamb of God; behold Him, Who takes away the sin of the world; happy are they who are called to His Supper.

Lord, I am not worthy to receive You; but only say the Word and my soul will be healed.

Turn to us with mercy, Lord; for we have sinned against You: help us, God our Saviour; rescue us for the honour of Your Name. Alleluia!

Holy Communion follows.

Incense is used to honour Mary.
