A Reading from the latter Letter of Saint Paul to the Church in Corinth.

We have this treasure in earthen vessels, to show that the transcendent power belongs to God and not to us. We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our bodies. For while we live we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be manifested in our mortal flesh. So death is at work in us, but life in you. Since we have the same spirit of faith as he had who wrote, "I believed, and so I spoke," we too believe, and so we speak, knowing that he who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and bring us with you into his presence. For it is all for your sake, so that as grace extends to more and more people it may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew. Glory be to Thee, O Lord.

The mother of the sons of Zeb'edee came up to him, with her sons, and kneeling before him she asked him for something. And he said to her, "What do you want?" She said to him, "Command that these two sons of mine may sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your But Jesus answered, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I am to drink?" They said to him, "We are able." He said to them, "You will drink my cup, but to sit at my right hand and at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared by my Father." And when the ten heard it, they were indignant at the two brothers. But Jesus called them to him and said, "You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great men exercise authority over them. It shall not be so among you; but whoever would be great among you must be your servant, and whoever would be first among you must be your slave; even as the Son of man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise be to Thee, O Christ.

A homily may follow.

As we honour today the memory of Saint James the Great, let us pray that his work may be continued in the Church and in the world:

Father, Your Son called men and women to leave the past behind them and to follow Him as His disciples in the way of the Cross. Strengthen and sustain those whom He has called today, marked with the cross and made His disciples within the Church: Lord, hear us ... Lord, graciously hear us.

Your Son told His disciples not to be afraid, and at Easter breathed on them His gift of peace. Look with mercy upon the world into which He sent them out and give it Your peace: Lord, hear us ... Lord, graciously hear us.

Father, Your Son called labourers into His vineyard. May all who are engaged in manual work be treated with fairness and valued for the part they play in sustaining and developing our world: Lord, hear us ... Lord, graciously hear us.

Your Son formed around Him a company who were no longer servants but friends, and He called all those who obeyed Him His brother and sister and mother. Look with love upon our families and friends and upon the communities of which we are a part: Lord, hear us ... Lord, graciously hear us.

Your Son sent out disciples to preach and heal the sick. Look with mercy on all those in distress and dis-ease, who yearn to feel Your loving touch: Lord, hear us ... Lord, graciously hear us.

Your Son promised those who followed Him that they would sit on thrones judging the twelve tribes of Israel and would share the Banquet of Heaven. According to Your promise enfold in Your eternal love those who have walked their path on earth: Lord, hear us ... Lord, graciously hear us.

In union with our Lady, Saint Matthew, Saint Philip, Saint James the Great, Saint Augustine, Saint Ignatius Loyola and all the saints, we ask for obedience to work Your will, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.

We are fellow citizens with the saints and the whole household of God through Jesus Christ our Lord, Who came and preached peace to those who were afar off and those who were near.

As the bread and wine are brought to the Altar and prepared for the Mass, the following is sung:

You shall make them princes in all lands: they shall remember Your Name, O Lord, from generation to another.

Here, while the Cherubim within the veil, adore the blest, life-giving Trinity, we in earth's worship echoing their part, hymn the thrice-holy in their company. So let all earthly cares be laid aside, that we may welcome Him Who draweth nigh, the King of Glory entering His courts, girt by the hidden armies of the sky. Alleluia, alleluia!

The preparation of the Altar continues; incense may be used to honour the place where Christ will become present. At the end:

Thine, O Lord, is the greatness, the power and the glory and the victory and the majesty. All that is in Heaven and earth is Thine: All things come of Thee, O Lord, and of Thine own do we give Thee.

Lord God, today we honour Your servant James, the first Apostle to share the cup of suffering and death. Receive our offering of praise and thanksgiving, and renew us in the service of Your Son Jesus Christ, Who came not to be served but to serve, and give His life as a ransom for the many; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.

The priest begins the great prayer of thanksgiving:

The Lord be with you.

And with thy spirit.

Lift up your hearts;

We lift them up unto the Lord.

Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.

It is meet and right so to do.

It is indeed right and good,
That we should give You thanks and praie
Through Jesus Christ Your Son, our Lord.
For after His Resurrection He sent out His Apostles
To preach the Gospel to all nations
And lead us in the way of Truth.
Himself the chief cornerstone,
He founded His Church to stand firm for ever
As a sign of Your holiness upon earth
And a living witness to all of the way that leads to Heave.
And so with angels and archangels
And with all the company of Heave,
We join the Hosts of Heaven in their triumphant song.

We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his Apostles and, taking bread, he praised you.

He broke the bread, gave it to them and said:

Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

The priest holds up the consecrated Host for the people to see.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine.

Again he praised you, gave it to them and said:

Drink this, all of you;
this is my blood of the new covenant,
which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

The priest holds up the chalice of consecrated wine for the people to see.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross.

Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth. Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with [N and] all the saints to feast at your table in heaven.

Through Jesus Christ, our Lord, By Whom and with Whom and in Whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.

Instructed by saving precepts and taught by divine example, we are bold to say:

Our Father,

The priest holds up the consecrated elements and invites people to receive Holy Communion:

+ Behold the Lamb of God; behold Him, Who takes away the sin of the world; happy are they who are called to His Supper.

You who have followed Me shall sit on twelve thrones: judging the twelve tribes of Israel, says the Lord.

Holy Communion follows.

4. O Jesu, form within us Thy likeness clear and true; By Thine example win us To suffer or to do.

5. This Law itself fulfilleth, Christlike to Christ is nigh, And, where the Father willeth, Shall sit with Christ on high.
