Text of the Mass for S Thomas (3rd July) 2024

As the priest enters the church, the following is sung:

1. Blessed Thomas, doubt no longer,
See the wounds in hand and side,
Now behold the risen Saviour
Who for Thee has bled and died,
And from death's dark pit arising,
Lives in body glorified.

2. Here behold the love victorious,
Over death triumphant now,
See the feet where nails were driven,

A Reading from the Letter to the Church in Ephesus.

You are no longer strangers and sojourners, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone, in whom the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; in whom you also are built into it for a dwelling place of God in the Spirit.

The Gospel book is carried to the Lectern:

Alleluia, alleluia! You believe, Thomas, because you can see Me, says the Lord; happy are those who have not seen and yet believe. Alleluia!

Christ's Presence in the words of the Gospel may be honoured with incense.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

Glory be to Thee, O Lord.

Thomas, one of the twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see in his hands the print of the nails, and place my finger in the mark of the nails, and place my hand in his side, I will not believe." Eight days later, his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. The doors were shut, but Jesus came and stood among them, and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side; do not be faithless, but believing." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe."

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise be to Thee, O Christ.

A homily may follow.

As we honour today the memory of Saint Thomas, let us pray that their work may be continued in the Church and in the world:

Father, Your Son called men and women to leave the past behind them and to follow Him as His disciples in the way of the Cross. Strengthen and sustain those whom He has called today, marked with the cross and made His disciples within the Church: Lord, hear us ... **Lord, graciously hear us.**

Your Son told His disciples not to be afraid, and at Easter breathed on them His gift of peace. Look with mercy upon the world into which He sent them out and give it Your peace: Lord, hear us ... **Lord, graciously hear us.**

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Your Son calls to His service people with many different skills to build a better world. Guide and protect those who work in the construction industry to share in Your creative work: Lord, hear us ... [Lord, graciously hear us.](#)

Your Son formed around Him a company who were no longer servants but friends, and He called all those who obeyed Him His brother and sister and mother. Look with love upon our families and friends and upon the communities of which we are a part: Lord, hear us ... [Lord, graciously hear us.](#)

Your Son gave sight to the blind that He might know Your power to save. Open the eyes of all that we may see and believe: Lord, hear us ... [Lord, graciously hear us.](#)

Your Son sent out disciples to preach and heal the sick. Look with mercy on all those in distress and dis-ease, who yearn to feel Your loving touch: Lord, hear us ... [Lord, graciously hear us.](#)

Your Son promised those who followed Him that they would sit on thrones judging the twelve tribes of Israel and would share the Banquet of Heaven. According to Your promise enfold in Your eternal love those who have walked their path on earth: Lord, hear us ... [Lord, graciously hear us.](#)

In union with our Lady, Saint Matthew, Saint Philip, Saint Thomas, Saint Thomas More, Saint Augustine and all the saints, we ask for obedience to work Your will, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

As the bread and wine are brought to the Altar and prepared for the Mass, the following is sung:

Their sound is gone out into all lands: and their words unto the ends of the world.

Here, while the Cherubim within the veil, adore the blest, life-giving Trinity, we in earth's worship echoing their part, hymn the thrice-holy in their company. So let all earthly cares be laid aside, that we may welcome Him Who draweth nigh, the King of Glory entering His courts, girt by the hidden armies of the sky. Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!

The preparation of the Altar continues; incense may be used to honour the place where Christ will become present.

The priest holds up the chalice of consecrated wine for the people to see.

Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation,
we proclaim his death and resurrection
until he comes in glory.

Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

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Lord of all life,

and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth.
Look with favour on your people,
gather us in your loving arms
and bring us with [*N and*] all the saints
to feast at your table in heaven.
