Father in Heaven, Whose Son Jesus Christ was wonderfully transfigured before chosen witnesses on the holy mountain, and spoke of the exodus He would accomplish at Jerusalem: give us strength so to hear His voice and bear our cross that in the world to come we may seem Him as He is; Who is alive and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, God, throughout all ages world without end.

A Reading from the latter Epistle General of Saint Peter.

We did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of his majesty. For when he received honour and glory from God the Father and the voice was borne to him by the Majestic Glory, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased," we heard this voice borne from heaven, for we were with him on the holy mountain. And we have the prophetic word made more sure. You will do well to pay attention to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts.

This is the Word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

The Lord is king: let the earth rejoice; ♦ let the multitude of the isles be glad.

Clouds and darkness are round about him; ♦ righteousness and justice are the foundation of his throne.

The mountains melted like wax at the presence of the Lord, ♦ at the presence of the Lord of the whole earth.

The heavens declared his righteousness, ♦ and all the peoples have seen his glory.

For you, Lord, are most high over all the earth; ♦ you are exalted far above all gods.

*The Gospel book is carried to the Lectern:*

Alleluia, alleluia! This is My Son, the Beloved; He enjoys My favour; listen to Him. Alleluia!

*Christ's Presence in the words of the Gospel may be honoured with incense.*

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

Glory be to Thee, O Lord.

Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And as he was praying, the appearance of his countenance was altered, and his raiment became dazzling white. And behold, two men talked with him, Moses and Eli'jah, who appeared in glory and spoke of his departure, which he was to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and those who were with him were heavy with sleep, and when they wakened they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. And as the men were parting from him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is well that we are here; let us make three booths, one for you and one for Moses and one for Eli'jah" -- not knowing what he said. As he said this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were afraid as they entered the cloud. And a voice came out of the cloud, saying, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" And when the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silence and told no one in those days anything of what they had seen.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise be to Thee, O Christ.

*A homily may follow.*

As the people to whom the Lord has granted a glimpse of the great light of His glory, let us pray that He will shine that light on those who live still in a land of deep darkness.

Lord of glory, look with favour on those in need and distress, suffering as Your Son has suffered; may the dawn break and Christ the Morning Star bring them the Light of His comfort and hope: Lord, hear us... [Lord, graciously hear us.](#)

Lord of Glory, look with favour on all who have died, amongst them the dead of Nagasaki and Hiroshima; grant them to see Christ in majesty with their own eyes and to be changed into His likeness from glory to glory: Lord, hear us... [Lord, graciously hear us.](#)

In union with our Lady, Saint Peter, Saint Matthew, Saint John, Saint James, Saint Philip, Saint Augustine and all the saints, we pray that the glory of the Lord may rise upon the whole world; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

*The preparation of the Altar continues; incense may be used to honour the place where Christ will become present. At the end:*

Thine, O Lord, is the greatness, the power and the glory and the victory and the majesty. All that is in Heaven and earth is Thine:  
All things come of Thee, O Lord, and of Thine own do we give Thee.

Holy God, receive our sacrifice this day, and bring us to that radiant glory, Which we see in the transfigured face of Jesus Christ our Lord.

*The priest begins the great prayer of thanksgiving:*

The Lord be with you.

And with thy spirit.

Lift up your hearts;

We lift them up unto the Lord.

Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.

It is meet and right so to do.

It is indeed right and good,

our duty and our joy,

always and everywhere to give you thanks,

holy Father, almighty and eternal God,

through Jesus Christ our Lord.

For on this day he revealed his glory

before his chosen witnesses

and filled with divine splendour

the human flesh in which he is one with us.

So he prepared his disciples

to bear the scandal of the cross

and showed that in the Church, his body,

the same glory would be fulfilled

that shone forth from him, its head.

And so with joyful hearts we echo on earth

the song of the angels in heaven

as they praise your glory without end:

Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of hosts.

Heaven and earth are full of Thy glory.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

*The priest holds up the chalice of consecrated wine for the people to see.*

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did,  
in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice  
made once for all upon the cross.  
Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation,  
we proclaim his death and resurrection  
until he comes in glory.

Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

Tell no on about the vision you have seen until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.
