
The Great East Window



The Great East Window is by George Eamer Kempe: it was Composition 491, executed in July 1899.

It is a *Jesse Window* combined with an *Arbor Vitae*. In a time when the Liturgy and inscriptions were in Latin and the majority of people could not read, stained glass was used to illustrate Biblical stories. The *Jesse Window* gives the genealogy (or some of it) as documented in the Gospels of Saint Matthew (1: 11 - 17) and Saint Luke (3: 23 - 38). It is called after Jesse, the father of King David. The *Arbor Vitae* mainly illustratess a succession of prophets whose prophecies are associated with the coming of Christ.
